Hong Kong's First Golfing Olympian Gets Welcome Boost to Kickstart Professional Career

Chan, who has returned to her home land to defend her EFG Hong Kong Ladies Open title this week, added:

I will never forget when they jumped in to help me kickstart my college career with a scholarship, and without a doubt, that opportunity propelled me onto the most efficient and effective track to achieving my dreams. Now that the local star has turned professional, she has expressed her desire to do more to give back to the local community so those who look up to her can have every chance to use sport as a

To achieve her goal, Tiffany has announced that she will team up with the official charity partner of the EFG Hong Kong Ladies Open, Friends of Asia Hong Kong, to embark on a Corporate Social Responsibility course to empower and better the lives of disadvantaged youngsters through sports. Tiffany will be the Charity Ambassador of Friends of Asia and as a key part of this joint charity drive, FOA will donate HK\$1,000 for every birdie Chan hits in the EFG Hong Kong Ladies Open 2017 and HK\$100 per birdie in all officially-sanctioned tournaments she plays in thereafter for the next three years. Chan has also named InspiringHK Sports Foundation as her beneficiary, an NGO that works with underprivileged kids to promote sports, one which is close to her heart and ties in with her philanthropy objectives.

"Friends of Asia is proud to be working with Tiffany Chan to advocate its mission to promote health and wellness through sports, and to provide resources, care, and opportunities for the underprivileged in Hong Kong. Her inspiration to other juniors comes from her determination, perseverance, self-discipline and sportsmanship – all the important values needed to drive positive changes to our community. She is always looking for opportunities to give back to the community by participating in various golf outreach programs, do her bit to help those in need, so they too can be given a chance like she was given when she first picked up a golf club in Tuen Mun all those years ago. Together with Tiffany and InspiringHK, we look forward to more collaboration in helping local kids in the coming future."
